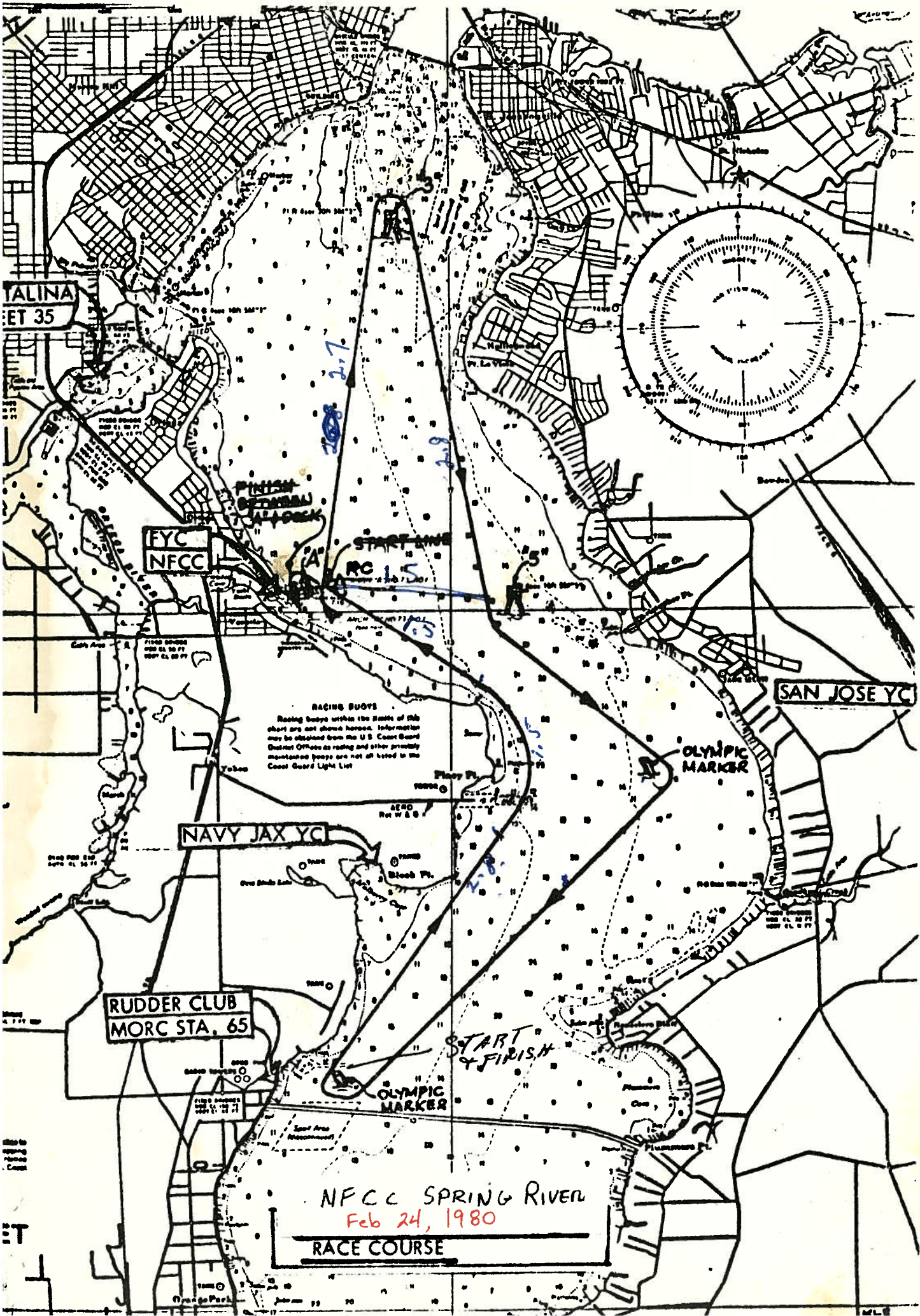


NFCC

Spring River Race

Date: FEB 24, 1980  
Location: Rudder Club  
Registration: 10:00 to 12:00  
Skippers Meeting: 12:30  
Start: 13:30

1. ELIGIBILITY: Yachts must be single-hulled vessels, of thoroughly seaworthy type, strongly built and rigged, properly ballasted, with enclosed cabins.
2. Management: The race will be under the management of the North Florida Cruising Club which shall have full powers to interpret these conditions. It is the responsibility of the owner and master of each yacht to see that his vessel is seaworthy in hull, rig, and gear, and responsible for accident or injury to any vessel or crew suffered in any way from any cause during or related to the race.
3. Classes: The fleet will be divided into the following classes, IOR, MORC, PHRF "A", PHRF "B", and Cat. 22. Trophies will be awarded as follows: 1st for 3&4 boat fleets, 1st & 2nd for 5 & 6 boat fleets, and 1st, 2nd, & 3rd for fleets of 7 or more boats.
4. Crew: The minimum crew shall be two persons.
5. Racing Rules & Right of Way: The race will be conducted under the current Yacht Racing Rules of the International Yacht Racing union as adopted by USYRU. The 720° rule will be in effect.
