

1 RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*.
- 1.2 If there is a conflict between languages the English text will take precedence.

2 Eligibly and Entry

- 2.1 Racing will be one-design competition in SAYC 420s and SAYC or Member Lasers.
- 2.2 Skippers must be SAYC members (crew need not be). Skippers must be experienced and proficient in sailing 420s, and have proper SAYC check-out approval. SAYC RCoS reserves the right to disqualify any competitor for unsafe boat handling.
- 2.3 There are 2 available SAYC Lasers which will be assigned on a first come first served basis.
- 2.4 The Championship Regatta will consist of the top boats from the combined scores of Regattas 1 & 2, based on number of available boats.

3 Fees

3.1 Entry Fee will be \$25.00 (\$15.00 for Lasers using their own boat) tax inclusive for each date, payment must be received prior to racing. SAYC Members may charge their house account.

6 Venue & Courses

- 6.1 Racing will be in Salt Run, Saint Augustine, FL.
- 6.2 Course will be at the discretion of the Race Committee.

7 Penalty System

7.1 Decisions of the protest committee will be final as provided in RRS 70.5.

8 Scoring

- 8.1 One design scoring as defined in RRS Appendix A.
- 8.2 Each boat will drop their worst race provided that 4 races have been sailed in each regatta.

9 Radio Communication

9.1 Radio Communication devices of any kind are prohibited.

10 Prizes

10.1 Prizes will be presented for 1st, 2nd and 3rd for skipper and crew (skipper for Lasers) at the SAYC Awards Banquet on 11/08/2020.

11 Disclaimer of Liability

11.1 Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See RRS 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.

12 Liability & Responsibility

- 12.1 Skippers are responsible and financially liable for any damage. Responsibility for collision damage between boats will be solely assigned by the Protest Committee.
- 12.2 Skipper's and crew are responsible for rigging, launching and retrieving their assigned boat.
