1 RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*.
- 1.2 If there is a conflict between languages the English text will take precedence.

2 Eligibly and Entry

- 2.1 One Design 420 Class:
- 2.2 Entry may be done online or by presenting entry form found at www.staugustineyachtclub.com.

3 Fees

- 3.1 Entry Fee will be \$25.00 inclusive of tax for the series, payment must be received prior to racing. SAYC Members may charge their house account.

4 Schedule

- 4.1 First warning signal will be at 15:55 each day. No race shall be started after 1800.

5 Sailing Instructions & Classes

- 5.1 One Design Class as defined in 2.2
- 5.2 Sailing Instructions will be available on 02/08/2021 at www.staugustineyachtclub.com and distributed to racing email list. Please contact sailcommodore.staugustineyc@gmail.com to be included in email list.

6 Venue & Courses

- 6.1 Racing will be in Salt Run in the vicinity of the Conch House.
- 6.2 Courses will be defined by Race Committee on day of race.
- 6.3 Gate will be open unless specified by Race Committee.

7 Penalty System

- 7.1 RRS 44.1 is changed so that the Two-Turns Penalty is replaced by the One-Turn Penalty.
- 7.2 Decisions of the protest committee will be final as provided in RRS 70.5.

8 Scoring

- 8.1 In accordance with RRS Appendix A, A4 omitted, high point scoring.

9 Radio Communication

- 9.1 Except in an emergency, a boat that is racing shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats.

10 Prizes

- 10.1 Daily results will be announced following racing at the SAYC.
- 10.2 Series prizes will be presented at the SAYC Awards Banquet on 11/14/2021.

11 Disclaimer of Liability

- 11.1 Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See RRS 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.

12 Liability & Responsibility

- 12.1 Skippers are responsible and financially liable for any damage. Responsibility for collision damage between boats will be solely assigned by the Protest Committee.
- 12.2 Skipper's and crew are responsible for rigging, launching and retrieving their assigned boat.

1 RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*.
- 1.2 If there is a conflict between these instructions and Notice of Race, these instructions shall take precedence.
- 1.3 If there is a conflict between languages the English text will take precedence.

2 Notices to Competitors

- 2.1 Notice to competitors will be posted on the office event website:

3 Changes to Sailing Instructions

- 3.1 Any change to the sailing instructions will be posted before 0900 on the day it will take effect, except that any change to the schedule of races will be posted by 2000 on the day before it will take effect.

4 Signals made Ashore

- 4.1 No signals will be made ashore.
- 4.2 If any race is to be cancelled
 - 4.2.1 It will be so indicated on the event website
 - 4.2.2 It will be announced as cancelled via email to participants

5 Schedule of Races

- 5.1 Schedule

- 5.2 To alert boats that a race or sequence of races will begin soon, the orange starting line flag will be displayed with one sound at least five minutes before a warning signal is made.

6 Classes

- 6.1 One Design Class

7 Racing Area

- 7.1 Racing will be in Salt Run in the vicinity of the Conch House.
- 7.2 Courses will be defined by Race Committee on day of race.
- 7.3 Gate will be open unless specified by Race Committee.

8 The Start

- 8.1 Three minute dinghy starts

9 Penalty System

- 9.1 For all classes RRS 44.1 is changed so that the Two-Turns Penalty is replaced by the One-Turn Penalty.

10 Time Limits

- 10.1 For all classes the time limit will be 30 minutes.

11 Protests and Requests for Redress

- 11.1 Protest forms are available at the Saint Augustine Yacht Club. Protests and requests for redress or reopening shall be delivered there within the appropriate time limit.
- 11.2 For each class, the protest time limit is 90 minutes after the last boat has finished the last race of the day or the race committee signals no more racing today, whichever is later.
- 11.3 Notices will be posted no later than 30 minutes after the protest time limit to inform competitors of hearings in which they are parties or named as witnesses. Hearings will be held at the Saint Augustine Yacht Club as soon as practical thereafter.

12 Scoring

- 12.1 High Point Scoring will be used
- 12.2 Boats in the starting area will be counted at the discretion of the race committee.

12.3 One race is required to be completed to constitute a series

13 Safety Regulations

13.1 A boat that retires from a race shall notify the race committee as soon as possible.

14 Radio Communication

14.1 Except in an emergency, or to comply with above instructions, a boat that is racing shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats.

15 Prizes

15.1 Daily results will be announced following racing at the SAYC.

15.2 Series prizes will be presented at the SAYC Awards Banquet on 11/14/2021.

16 Liability & Responsibility

16.1 Skippers are responsible and financially liable for any damage. Responsibility for collision damage between boats will be solely assigned by the Protest Committee.

16.2 Skipper's and crew are responsible for rigging, launching and retrieving their assigned boat.

16.3 A signed 2021 Race Waiver Form is required to be on file with SAYC.

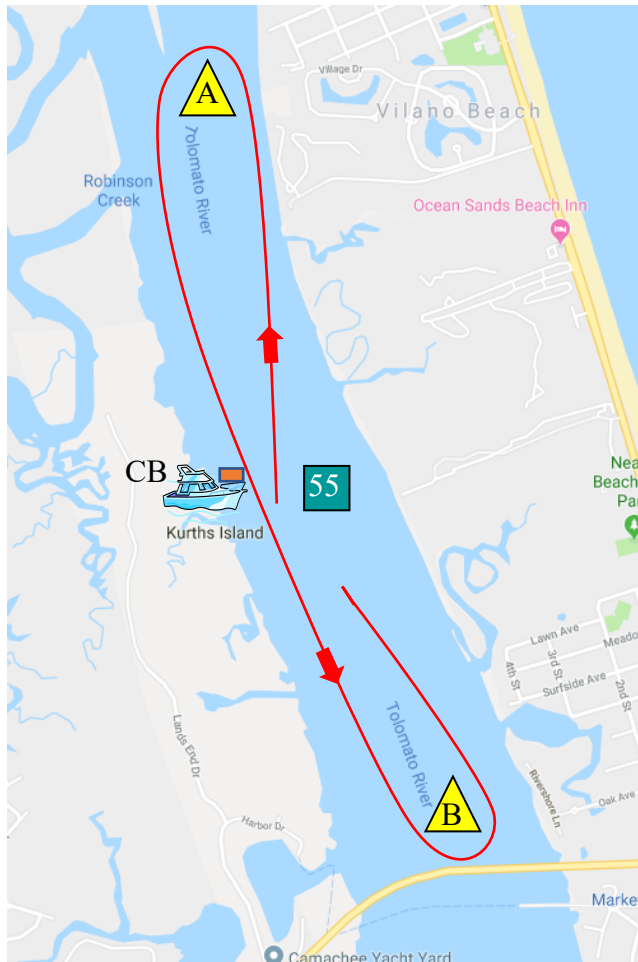


Sailing Instructions – Appendix A

General ICW Race Courses



Course - North



Course - South



Unless otherwise specified in NORs or Sailing Instructions, Inshore Saint Augustine Yacht Club events will use the following course diagrams.

1. The start/finish line will be between the Orange Flag on the Committee Boat (CB) and Government Mark 55.
2. Boats will start heading either north or south.
3. The race committee will identify Mark A and Mark B prior to starting. They may be government marks or other suitable temporary marks.
4. The race committee will specify the number of laps to be sailed.
5. Boats may not pass west of the Committee Boat, or east of Mark 55 while racing. In other words, the start/finish line must be crossed each time it is passed. Therefore, the committee boat and Mark 55 are marks of the course, as such RRS 18 applies. They should not be considered obstructions.
6. All other marks shall be rounded to port.

As an example, the race committee might make the following radio announcement: "Today's race shall be Course - South, once around. Mark A is Government Mark 57. Mark B is a yellow tetrahedron approximately 0.75 miles north of Mark 55." This should be interpreted and sailed as follows: (i) Start between CB and Mark 55 heading south (ii) round government mark 57 (Mark A) to port (iii) head north, leaving Mark 55 to starboard and CB to port (iv) round the yellow tetrahedron (Mark B) to port (v) head south, finish with CB to starboard and Mark 55 to port.

Race committee may shorten course for one or more classes according to RRS 32.2 and may finish boats between CB and Mark 55.
