### 1 RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*, FCSA PHRF Rules and FCSA Bylaws.
- 1.2 If there is a conflict between languages the English text will take precedence.

# 2 Eligibly and Entry

- 2.1 All sailboats as defined in FCSA PHRF Rules and FCSA Bylaws.
- 2.2 At the discretion of the Race Committee, provisional ratings may be given, while ratings are being processed by FCSA. FCSA membership and valid rating are required to be eligible for prizes.
- 2.3 Entry may be done online or by presenting entry form found at <a href="www.staugustineyachtclub.com">www.staugustineyachtclub.com</a>.

### 3 Fees

3.1 Entry Fee will be \$50.00 (\$35.00 SAYC Members) inclusive of tax for the regatta, payment must be received prior to racing. SAYC Members may charge their house account.

### 4 Schedule

- 4.1 Skipper's Meeting will be held at the St. Augustine Yacht Club at 1000 on October 03, 2021.
- 4.2 First warning signal will be at 1255.

## 5 Sailing Instructions & Classes

- 5.1 There will be one cruising class. Performance boats will be penalized -6 Seconds per Mile for each performance sail declared.
- 5.2 Sailing Instructions will be available on 09/26/2021 at <a href="www.staugustineyachtclub.com">www.staugustineyachtclub.com</a> and distributed to racing email list. Please contact sailcommodore.staugustineyc@gmail.com to be included in email list.

### 6 Venue & Courses

- 6.1 Racing will be in the vicinity of STA East of the Saint Augustine Inlet.
- 6.2 Courses will be provided in Sailing Instructions and at the skippers meeting.
- 6.3 In the event of adverse weather racing will occur north of the Vilano Bridge in the Tolomato River.

## 7 Penalty System

7.1 Decisions of the protest committee will be final as provided in RRS 70.5.

#### 8 Scoring

- 8.1 The scoring system is as follows: Low Point Scoring as defined in RRS Appendix A.
- 8.2 Corrected times will be calculated using PHRF Time on Time.

## 9 Radio Communication

- 9.1 Except in an emergency, a boat that is racing shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats.
- 9.2 Race Committee will use VHF Channel 72 for course announcements and registration.

## 10 Prizes

- 10.1 Results will be announced at the SAYC after racing. All participants are encouraged to attend for cocktails and dinner.
- 10.2 Prizes will be presented for 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> at the SAYC Awards Banquet on 11/14/2021. The perpetual trophy will be awarded to the lowest corrected time for cruising class.

## 11 Disclaimer of Liability

11.1 Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See RRS 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury, or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.

## 12 SAYC Associate Membership

12.1 A portion of the non-member skipper's registration fee will pay for and grant a SAYC Associate Membership of the skipper for the duration of events hosted at the SAYC, that are directly related to this race, regatta or series. By registering for this event and attending any related event hosted at the SAYC clubhouse, skippers (non-member or otherwise) acknowledge that they are responsible for the conduct of their guests (the SAYC Code of Conduct may be found on the notice board inside the clubhouse) and any debt that their guests may incur.

# 13 Insurance

13.1 Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum coverage of \$250,000 per incident or the equivalent.

# 4 Signals made Ashore

- 4.1 No signals will be made ashore.
- 4.2 If the race is to be cancelled or postponed prior to 1000 October 03, 2021
  - 4.2.1 It will be indicated per SI 2.1
  - 4.2.2 It will be announced as cancelled or postponed via email to participants
- 4.3 Skippers Meeting at the SAYC Clubhouse 1000 October 03, 2021 (registrations closed at end of meeting)

### 5 Schedule of Races

5.1 Schedule – October 03, 2021

All boats start at 1300 – there will be no flags or sequence

- 5.2 One race is scheduled.
- 5.3 There will be no committee boat on station. The course will be announced by a designated boat. The designated boat will announce herself as such at 1230. The designated boat will do a time check at approximately 1245.

## 6 Classes and Class Flags

- 6.1 There will only be one class. Declaration of Spinnaker or Non-Spinnaker must be made prior to the end of the skippers meeting. See 14 Scoring below for time adjustments for Performance boats.
- 6.2 There will be no class flags or signals


# 7 Racing Areas

### 8 Marks & Courses

- 8.1 The only mark will be ATON "STA"
- 8.2 The course will be announced as Medium or Short by the designated boat no later than 1245.

- 8.4 Boats start at ATON STA as described below and must "touch" the three remaining sides of the box.
- 8.5 Boats may "touch" each side at any point along each latitude or longitude described.
- 8.6 Boats may "touch" each side in any order of her choosing.
- 8.7 If any boat is protested under RRS 28 she <u>MUST</u> be able to provide evidence of "touching" each side in the form a digital time-stamped photograph of her navigation device showing her position at the touch point. If she is unable to provide such evidence she shall be disqualified without a hearing, this changes RRS 63.

### 9 The Start

- 9.1 The start line runs south from ATON STA 300 feet.
- 9.2 The start will be at 1300 using GPS Time.
- 9.3 Any boat observed to be over early shall be protested by the observing boat. Along with the requirements of RRS 61.1, the protesting boat shall also make an announcement to the fleet via VHF 72.
- 9.4 A boat that does not start within 30 minutes after the start shall be scored DNS. This changes RRS A4 and A5.

#### 10 The Finish

- 10.1 A boat will be considered finished when she is within 300 feet of ATON STA and STA bears 090° m from the helmsperson.
- 10.2 Each competitor shall take her time when the helmsperson is at the appropriate bearing.
- 10.3 Each competitor shall report her finish time over VHF 72 at the earliest opportunity.
- 10.4 Each competitor shall report her time as "Yacht Name XX:XX:XX" via text to 781-742-5600 within 30 minutes of her finish time.

#### 11 Time Limits

11.1 For all classes the time limit will be 4 hours.

### 13 Protests and Requests for Redress

- 13.1 Protest forms are available at the Saint Augustine Yacht Club. Protests and requests for redress or reopening shall be delivered there within the appropriate time limit.
- 13.2 For each class, the protest time limit is 90 minutes after the last boat has finished.
- 13.3 Notices will be posted no later than 30 minutes after the protest time limit to inform competitors of hearings in which they are parties or named as witnesses. Hearings will be held at the Saint Augustine Yacht Club as soon as practical thereafter.
- 13.4 Intent to protest shall be sent via text to 781-742-5600 as "Yacht A protesting Yacht B for breaking RRS X.XX, Y.YY, etc." within 30 minutes of the protesting boats finish.

#### 14 Scoring

- 14.1 Low Point Scoring will be used as defined in RRS Appendix A.
- 14.2 Corrected times will be calculated using PHRF Time on Time.

14.3 Boats using mains or jibs not made of woven polyester shall have a minus six (-6) second per mile adjustment to her rating per such sail used.

## 15 Safety Regulations

- 15.1 A boat that retires from a race shall notify other boats via VHF 72 and via text to 781-742-5600.
- 15.2 All boats must check-in with the designated boat, via VHF Channel 72 no later than 10 minutes before the start
- 15.3 See RRS 27.1 and 40.

## 16 Radio Communication

16.1 Except in an emergency, or to comply with above instructions, a boat that is racing shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats.

#### 17 Prizes

- 17.1 Prizes will be presented at the SAYC Awards Banquet on 11/14/2021
- 17.2 Prizes will be awarded for 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup>.
- 17.3 After race party and announcements will be held at the St. Augustine Yacht Club.
